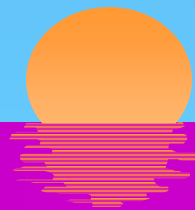
Preparation

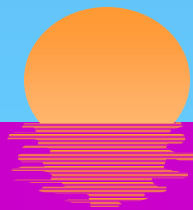
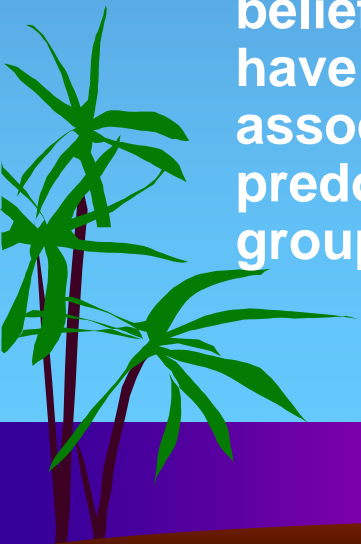


CULTURAL DIFFERENCES

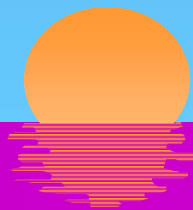

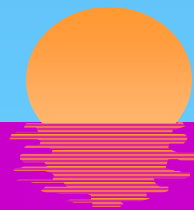
WHAT EAP DOES FOR THE STUDENT

1. Their placement

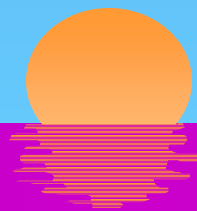
